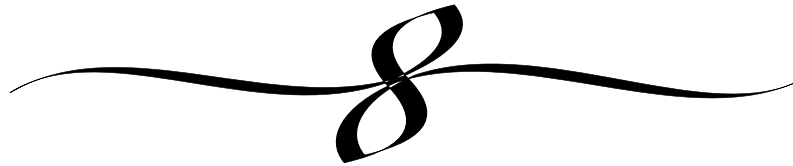
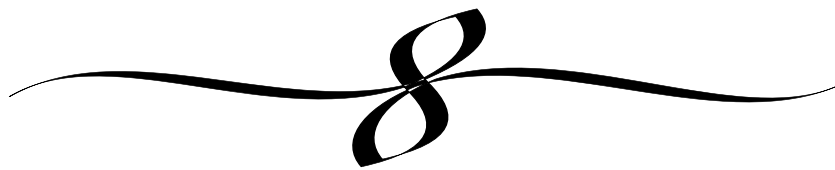

"Unique World Gifts" Ten Thousand Villages was selling fair trade food items and Reclaiming Christmas Cards were available. (Appendix Z)

#### **SERVICE OF WORSHIP AND CELEBRATION OF THE LORD'S SUPPER**

Worship was led by the Rev. Dr. Don Scofield and the music team from the Rutherfordton Presbyterian Church in Rutherfordton. Keynoter, Rev. Ray Jones, Coordinator of the Office of Evangelism PCUSA,

preached a sermon entitled "Following Jesus" with scripture from Luke 10:1-12. Worship concluded with the celebration of the Sacrament of the Lord's Supper.

### **DISCIPLESHIP AND SPIRITUAL GROWTH**

Following the morning sermon, Ray Jones led subsequent presentations focusing on Engage the Gospel, Discipleship, Your Community and Church Shifts. He challenged all to get out into the world and share the love that the Lord Jesus has for all. He encouraged sessions to obtain the pamphlet "*Engage*" ([www.pcusa.org/resource/engage](http://www.pcusa.org/resource/engage)) and with prayer and commitment, begin effective evangelical disciple-making in their communities. Pamphlets were available for those attending the Presbytery meeting.

### **PEACE AND JUSTICE COMMITTEE**

Anne Morgan and Grace Boyer reported on behalf of the Peace and Justice Committee and their work. The committee will make available Peacemaking Offering Grants in 2013. These grants will be at least \$250 to churches working in concrete ways toward peacemaking in the community or world. Decisions regarding grant applications will be made on January 29, 2013.

A sample resource provided through the North Carolina Council on Churches, "Becoming the Church Together: Immigration, the Bible and our New Neighbors," was distributed to churches. ### **MISSION COMMITTEE**

Billy Lowe spoke on behalf of the Mission Committee. He spoke of the mission teams to Malawi, members of teams, the ongoing needs in Malawi and Nkhoma Hospital, and thanked those who were participating in the collection of materials for Presbyterian Disaster Assistance Hygiene Kits that were to be assembled later at this meeting. Rev. Lowe expressed with deep appreciation thanks to Grace Boyer for her work with the Mission Committee and the Witness Division of the Presbytery of WNC during the last four years. (Appendix Z)

Tricia Thompson, Young Adult Volunteer in Kenya, from the First Presbyterian Church, Lincolnton, presented a detailed report of her work and experiences while serving as a Young Adult Volunteer. Churches were encouraged to seek out young adults in their congregations and challenge them to participate in the program. (Appendix Z)

### **CAMPUS MISSION**

On behalf of the Campus Mission Committee, Rev. Allen Smith reported on the work of the committee.

### **YOUTH COMMITTEE**

On behalf of the Youth Committee, Rev. Michael Bailey and Beth Gunn reported on the work of the committee and opportunities available to various youth leaders and groups. A Middle School Retreat is planned for November 9-11, 2012 at Camp Grier, Senior High Mission Retreat is planned for March 1-2, 2013 at the Black Mountain Home for Children, Youth and Adults, and 2013 Youth Triennium for July 16-20, 2013.

### **REFLECTIONS - MISSION OF THE PRESBYTERY**

Grace Boyer, Associate Presbyter, reflected on the past four plus years of serving the Presbytery of Western North Carolina. Looking back, she shared that it was the vision for "mission" that brought her to Western North Carolina along with the diversity and differences. Through her many visits with churches and committees, she had an opportunity to be in or at all but six of the presbytery's 112 churches. In closing, she

shared that it had been a privilege and joy to be with the churches and this presbytery. She challenged the presbytery to focus on the work of the Presbytery and to live in peace.

The Presbytery acknowledged the fruitful ministry that Grace shared with the Presbytery and prayed God's blessing on her continued ministry in Korea.

Rev. Beverly Brock led the Presbytery in prayers of intercession. The Presbytery recessed for lunch at 12:15 p.m.

The moderator reconvened the Presbytery at 1:05 p.m. with prayer, and song and an opportunity for Presbyterians to address the Presbytery with announcements, concerns, and opinions.

### **REPORT OF THE GENERAL PRESBYTER**

Bobbi White gave thanks for everyone that is, and has been a part of this presbytery. As the Presbytery enters into a time of studying the mission of the Presbytery, she asked that everyone be in prayer for the Mission Study Task Force as they face the challenges ahead. She encouraged each person to go out and share their faith and their gifts with the world. (Appendix V)

### **EVANGELISM COMMITTEE**

On behalf of the Evangelism Committee, Reverends Ann and Frank Aichinger reported on the work of the committee and what it means to be a Presbyterian. During their presentation, they shared information and promoted 1001 Worshiping Communities.

### **FINANCE/STEWARDSHIP - PRESBYTERY FINANCIAL REALITY CHECK**

Jay Crane, chair of Budget & Finance Committee, gave a detailed "Financial Reality Check" of the Presbytery. Contributions to our Presbytery have declined 25% since 2005, with only ten churches giving over two-thirds of those contributions and that 29 of our 111 congregations have given nothing, forcing other churches to pay their share of the required contributions to the Synod and General Assembly. (Appendix X)

### **PRESBYTERY MISSION TODAY AND TOMORROW**

Ed Brenegar, chair of the Stewardship Committee, led the Presbytery through a set of questions that our Mission Study Task Force will be studying as they work through their tasks in determining the needs of the Presbytery. Participants spent an hour discussing what members of their congregations were passionate about, what obstacles their churches were encountering, and how their Presbytery could help them. A summary of the each groups responses was collected, compiled and turned over to the Mission Study Task Force. (Appendix X)

Grandfather Home for Children will be celebrating 100 Years of Helping Children heal and thrive in 2013. Several special events will be held on its historical campus in Banner Elk beginning May 18, 2013 and continuing through October 11, 2013. She shared that the home is in need of prayers and financial support to continue to sustain and improve their ministry's work.

### **DALLAS GLOBAL MISSION CONSULTATION & GUATEMALA PARTNERSHIP**

Ellen Dozier recently attended the Global Mission Consultation in Dallas, Texas where they celebrated 175 years of mission. During the consultation, talks and discussions were held pertaining to world mission and what is happening in the mission field. Not only are we involved mission through church partnerships in third world countries, but other countries are sending mission workers to the US.

As part of partnerships, the Presbytery of Western North Carolina has been traveling back and forth for the past 18 years to Guatemala. Prayers are requested for a team that will be leaving for Guatemala October 30 for an annual meeting of Partnership Committees of the three Presbyteries - WNC, Sur Occidente and Suchitepequez.
